DEFENSIVE DRIVING FOR THOSE 55+

Today's roads are much faster and more dangerous, which is why it's a good idea to take a defensive driving course



and make sure you're ready for the hazards of everyday driving. There will be a review of the state regulations and road signs, in addition to essential defensive driving techniques that may help you avoid an accident! You'll learn adjustments to accommodate common agerelated changes in vision, hearing, and reaction time. According to Minnesota state law, people age 55 and older who complete a state approved defensive driving course are eligible to receive a 10%, three-year discount on auto insurance. The class consists of lecture, films, and discussions. There is no behind-the-wheel driving and there are no tests. Once you have completed the full eight hour course, a four hour refresher is needed every three years. ADVANCED WOODBURNING: FAMILY TREE WOOD ART

Instructor: Cindy Kawlewski

What better way to display your family tree...than on a tree! Your genealogy chart is hand illustrated with love and engraved (burned) into a basswood slab. This personalized piece of art will become a family heirloom and a conversation starter for any home. This piece will be one that you can continue to add to. Just like trees, each wood slab is unique and may have natural flaws (blemishes/dark spots/knots) or may not be perfectly round. Wood slices are approximately 9 ½" to 11" diameter and 1 ½" thick. A sawtooth hanger can be mounted on the back for easy hanging if you desire. Students will practice woodburning and then will draw their family tree on the slice of wood and then begin woodburning in class. This project is a time consuming and students may not complete it entirely during class and may need to work on it at home. Please bring a woodburner to class.





DRIVERS EDUCATION

DRIVERS TRAINING PROCESS

If you are looking to get a driver's license in Minnesota, you must first obtain a learner's permit. To do so, you'll need to complete 30 hours of classroom instruction required by law. The course teaches the principles of road awareness and safety for prospective first-time drivers. Students must be 14 years of age and older. Upon successful completion of this class, students will receive a blue card.



Behind the wheel training is available for anyone who currently holds a valid permit in the State of Minnesota. Individuals must have their permit six months prior to getting their license. Students will receive behind the wheel once registered (closer to the time of his/her sixteenth birthday) or when a six month waiting period is near completion, whichever is further out, with an exception for those obtaining a farm permit. Please do not register for behind the wheel until you receive your hard copy of the learner permit.

SETZVICES AND SUPPOTETS FOTZ INDIVIDUALS WITH AUTISM OTZ SOCIAL CHALLENGES

Empowering Kids Perham, a nonprofit organization located in Perham, MN, was created to provide services for children with **autism or social challenges**. We provide exceptional, compassionate care for children and families so that every child will reach his or her full potential.



INDIVIDUAL SERVICES (All Ages)

To better suit the needs of all families, we also offer 1/2 hour or 1 hour individual or small group services outside of after school program times.



EARLY INTERVENTION / PRESCHOOL (Ages 2 - PreK)

Early Intervention services and supports are critical in the future outcomes for children. This early help for families is important because it is a time when the brain is flexible for shaping and guiding development of skills and overall behavior. The goal of this program is to practice the skills needed to be successful in a daycare or preschool environment such as: following directions, sharing/playing with others, and attention to task. Early intervention services are offered through individual services or in a small group setting.



AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMMING (Ages K-18)

Our afterschool program, for children with autism or social challenges, includes social emotional learning sessions that feature fun games, and other engaging activities that develop social-emotional skills. Children learn how to make friends, manage their emotions, solve problems, and deal with peer pressure. Children rotate between 1/2 hour sessions that consist of Social Emotional Learning, snack, sensory time, homework/reading, and choice time to include computers, games, Legos, reading, playground, or Wii. All of this takes place in a structured environment while always working to promote social skills use and generalization. (If your child is not yet able to function in a small group setting, 1:1 services are available to help them establish the necessary skills.)



SPECIAL INTEREST FRIDAYS (Ages 4th Grade & Up)

Many individuals with autism have untapped potential that may include visual, artistic and academic skills. Our Special Interest program will further explore student's preferred knowledge subjects through readings, videos, discussions and experiments. Students will learn more about their interests, as well as others, and understand how those interests can be used to develop hobbies, avenues for social interaction and potentially careers. (If your child is not yet able to function in a small group setting, 1:1 services are available to help them establish the necessary skills.)



SCHOLARSHIPS

The Empowering Kids Perham scholarship program provides financial help/assistance for families with children diagnosed with autism or other special needs, and who would benefit from programming at EKP. The purpose of this program is to help families gain access to affordable services and programs that will enhance the quality of life for their child with autism, or other social challenges.
