Shane Kangas

FHS class of '85, Shane was a three-sport athlete playing football, basketball, and baseball. Even with all the athletic activities, he was able to secure an induction into the National Honor Society. In football, he was named All-Conference as well as MVP of the Heart-of-Lakes (HOL) Conference in 1985. During the winter season, Shane earned All-Conference in basketball. A four-year baseball starter, he attained three additional All-Conference titles. As a junior and senior, he was honored as the Park Region Conference MVP. His senior year he was named to both the All-State and Lions All Star selection Team. In 1989, he graduated from the University of Minnesota (Big 10) after pitching and earning letters for four consecutive years for the Gophers. In 1989, he was designated as the Gopher Player of the Year and capped off his career with a 21-7 win/loss career.

Scott Bergman

Graduating from Frazee in 1981, Scott earned 11 letters in five sports: football (3), basketball (3), baseball (3), track (1), and golf (1). He was recognized as an All-Conference recipient in football (1), basketball (1), and baseball (3). In baseball, he was also awarded 1981 Park Region Conference MVP and the first Frazee baseball player to be chosen to play in the Lions All Star Game. He continued his athletic pursuits at South Dakota State University and later at Bemidji State University where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Education in 1985. He was a baseball letter winner at both colleges. Academically, he obtained a Master's in Education from St. Thomas University in 1992. As a coach, Scott is the current head girls' basketball coach at Sauk Centre High School. He has been their coach for the past 11 years achieving a win/loss record of 201-102. His teams made four state appearances with a state runner-up title in 2012. During his years, he was selected twice as the state girls' basketball Coach of the Year.

1985 Boys' Baseball Team

With a season record of 20-2 (one loss procured while at state), this was the first boys' team from Frazee High School to ever reach the state high school tournament. The team had an ERA of .90, a batting average of .305, and an average of 8.6 runs per game. Throughout the season, 14 home-runs were achieved. In 140 innings, 198 strikeouts were thrown with only 50 walks. Of the young men, three were named All-Conference players and one MVP of the league. Additionally, two All-Conference honorable mention players were also designated. Three of the athletes went on to play baseball at a collegiate level.
